#### Passage A: The UN Report on Climate Change

Greenhouse gas emissions trap the heat of the sun and lead to global warming and climate change. Warmer temperatures are changing weather patterns and destroying the balance of nature. This poses a very serious threat to human beings and all other forms of life in the world. Destructive storms have become more intense in many regions. As temperatures rise, more moisture evaporates, which exacerbates extreme rainfall and flooding, the result of which are more destructive storms. The frequency and extent of tropical storms is also affected by the warming ocean. \_\_(29)\_\_ feed on warm waters at the ocean surface. Such storms often destroy homes and communities, causing deaths and a huge amount of economic losses. Climate change also has impact on water availability, making it scarcer in more regions. Global warming exacerbates water shortages in water-stressed regions and is leading to an increased risk of agricultural droughts affecting crops, and ecological droughts increasing the vulnerability of ecosystems. Droughts can also stir destructive sand and dust storms that can move billions of tons of sand across continents. Deserts are expanding, reducing land for growing food. Many people now face the threat of not having enough water on a regular basis. Climate change also poses risks to the survival of species on land and in the ocean. These risks increase as temperatures climb. Exacerbated by climate change, the world is losing species at a rate 1,000 times greater than at any other time in recorded human history. One million species are at risk of becoming extinct within the next few decades. Forest fires, extreme weather, and invasive pests and diseases are among many threats related to climate change. Some species will be able to relocate and survive, but others will not.

## Passage B

Responding to widespread concern for Afghans, UN human rights chief Michelle Bachelet condemned the high unemployment rate of women and the restrictions placed on their dress. Women-owned and operated businesses have been forced to close, and that 1.2 million girls no longer have access to secondary education, in line with a decision by the <u>de facto</u> authorities who took power in 2021. The <u>de facto</u> authorities made promises that they would honor women's human rights obligations in line with Sharia law; however, the gradual exclusion of women and girls from the public sphere proved a broken promise. Aside from the problem of human right, it is also a matter of practical necessity. Amid the economic crisis, women's contribution to economy is indispensable, but this requires their access to education and freedom from violence. As an example of the <u>de facto</u> authorities' intentions to impose gender discrimination, women are now represented by men at grand assembly of religious scholars and elders. Such measures not only violate Afghanistan's obligations under numerous human rights treaties, but also create a culture of **impunity for domestic violence**, child marriage and sale and trafficking of girls, to name just a few of the consequences.
